In Her Own Words

In May, 1939, Mother Mary Teresa gave the following conference to the Bronx Junior Associates, at the Motherhouse of the Parish Visitors of Mary Immaculate.

"I want to talk about an early vocation. At the age of twelve, I knew just what I wanted. I wanted to be a Religious. I wanted to give myself to God and work for souls for Him. And I realized that Christ died for souls. I looked at the Crucifix and realized that He was there,

hanging on the Cross. He came to earth and He died to save each and every soul...

I want to show you a picture of a young vocation, the Blessed Virgin. The Blessed Virgin helped me when I was trying to work out my young vocation. People say, "Why don't you stay in the world, at least until you are twentyone?" and so on to another year, and another year. ...I had a hard time with my early vocation, but I succeeded in getting through...

Begin early, my dear girls. If I had known of a vocation like this when I was twelve years old, you could not have held me from it. Even at that age I was a missionary. In my early years I always had a class of children to teach. Our home was a Mission Center where the people would gather to go to Confession and Communion. We had Mass right in our home..."

"Be true to your early vocation if God has inspired it."


Parish Visitors of Mary Immaculate: Contemplative-Missionaries

Origin of the Community By Mother Mary Teresa Tallon

"This religious vocation originated in a Divine call to the greater love of God, to greater meekness for the love of God, in the practical compassionating of Our Lord's zeal for His forgotten and neglected children. Jesus came to earth because of the immortality of souls. He showed zeal for all souls, but especially for the poor and for children. If we were not immortal and all poor neglected little ones as

well, there would be no need for our vocation...Ours is not merely the usual religious vocation, for it emphasizes and unites the contemplative and unitive life with the missionary apostolate....we of the Community have the gift of a contemplative-missionary vocation. It is the grace offered to each and all the members, but there must be the individual cooperation with the Holy Spirit in response to the vocational gift....Sisters we shall not be powerful in God's service until we become saints"

Who Is Mother Mary Teresa Tallon?



- Her family owned a hops farm near Waterville, NY.
- From an early age, Julia sought to grow in her love for God and His people, especially those who had forgotten Him.
- At the age of 20, Julia entered the Sisters of the Holy Cross. She spent many years teaching elementary school, where she grew in her love for the most rejected and neglected of God's children.

EDICT

On 12 May 2012, Dr. Waldery Hilgeman, Postulator, has asked us to initiate the Diocesan Inquiry on the life, heroic virtues, and reputation of holiness and of intercessory power of the SERVANT OF GOD MARY TERESA TALLON, founder of the Congregation of the Parish Visitors of Mary Immaculate, born 07 May 1867 in Hanover, Oneida (Diocese of Syracuse) and died on 10 March 1954 in Monroe (Archdiocese of New York).

We, having known the virtues and reputation of holiness of the Servant of God have asked and obtained the *Nihil Obstat* of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints on 20 February 2013 (prot. N. 3085) to pursue her cause of beatification and canonization.

In informing our Ecclesial Community about this, we invite all the faithful to communicate to us directly or to send to the Tribunal of the Archdiocese of New York, any information, favorable or unfavorable, related to the reputation of holiness of the Servant of God.

Since, by the norms of the legal dispositions, all the writings attributed to her should be collected, by the present EDICT we indicate that anyone who is in possession of such writings should carefully send to the said Tribunal any document authored by the Servant of God that has not already been entrusted to the Postulation of the Cause.

We remind you that the word "writings" is not to be understood only of printed works, which have already been gathered, but also manuscripts, diaries, letters and every private writing of the Servant of God. Those who want to keep the original can present a duly authenticated copy.

We establish finally that the present EDICT is to remain visible for six months at the doors of the St. Patrick's Cathedral and of all Parish Churches of the Archdiocese of New York, and that it is to be published in "Catholic New York".
