August 15, 1920 is the official Foundation Day of the Parish Visitors of Mary Immaculate. That is the day that Mother Mary Teresa Tallon arrived in New York City to live in community with the young women who were to be the first Sisters of the new Community. (See pg 3.)

We are celebrating the 100th Anniversary of our Foundation this year, having completed a three year preparation for this milestone anniversary. Recently, we were reading Mother's writings from 1918 and found references to the "Spanish Influenza"! Mother reported that not only were the schools closed but Churches were, as well. The newspapers were kind enough to print the sermons of the priests and ministers of the local area. Mother stated that her one great sadness was not being able to receive Holy Communion! How familiar!

We know that these months have been very difficult on everyone: you have been in our thoughts and prayers. Have you gone to our YouTube Channel? There you will find a short video of the Sisters praying the "Prayer for Canonization" for Mother Foundress in front of her sarcophagus in our Motherhouse Chapel. We thought that since you could not come here to pray, we would bring Mother to you. Won't you join us in prayer? Ask BIG because Mother needs a miracle for her beatification.

We have not asked for some time for your renewal of membership in the Guild. It is your contributions that make it possible for us to continue the work of the canonization. Exile—Mother's Time of Waiting

In the summer of 1913, Mother Mary Teresa (then Sr. Mary Berchmans) was transferred away from New York City to St. Vincent de Paul Parish in Elkhart, IN. Her Superiors hoped that a change of location would show her that it was not God's Will for her to found a new Community. However, God continued to support Mother's vocation, and though she struggled daily with the separation from those whom God had called her to help, she continued to live out her contemplative-missionary call during this time that she called

her "exile."
The pastor of
the local
parish, Father
Francis
Jansen was
impressed
with Mother's
missionary
efforts and

asked her to do all she could for those who had wandered from

the Church. In addition to her teaching duties, Mother began a League of the Sacred Heart and

organized the Young Ladies of the Sodality into different sections to welcome new parishioners, provide Religious Plays, promote Religious reading, reach out to neglected Catholics, and promote daily Communion. She also was in charge of the junior Children of Mary, the altar servers, and others, whom she encouraged to reach out to those who were not living out their Catholic faith.

Meanwhile she had a very active correspondence with the

young women she had begun to train in NYC and various priests and bishops who were trying to help her found the new Community. The ardor of those in NYC seemed to be flagging and Mother was beginning to lose heart. However, the Lord provided a catalyst by way of a letter from Father Jansen. He told her that he thought she had a special call for the redemption of fallen away Catholics and should consider starting a new missionary Community. This renewed Mother's efforts, which eventually led to the Community being founded in 1920.

Mother Mary
Teresa arrived in
New York City on
Sunday, August 15,
1920. Here are
her own words
describing that
day. "Great things
cost great price,

and I was paying the cost in a severe spell of illness consisting of high fever, a sore and swollen throat... But I went through the evening's reception given quietly by my faithful friends at our residence... These friends were they who had survived the trials of waiting, and borne bravely the test of time, and were there to meet me, and welcome me back to the

community of willing religious-to-be. Blessed be God for their grace."

As Mother joined them, "they all greeted me in turn, and expressed their welcome in looks and words. Then I sat down and talked to them for a while, after which talk, we all repaired to the Chapel oratory and chanted the *Te Deum*, in thanksgiving for my safe arrival. This tribute of gratitude having been offered, the happy members took me through the whole house that I might see everything.

"When I retired that first night after my return to New York, my fever was 103...Four days went by before the temperature lowered...the loss I felt most was Holy Communion."

Mother was home. Her exile was over. Praise God!

In Her Own Words:

The Daily Struggle and Response in Exile

Nothing can make me forget that I am an exile, really and surely, from my place of God's call to me—the poor districts of New York City—where multitudes of my precious outcast children abide.

Here in Elkhart, my "Egypt," I try to do what good I can. Spiritual and religious instruction appeals to me, and I have resolved to lose no opportunity of imparting it, in season and out of season. That is my profession, "In my meditation a fire shall flame out" -

This is the means. If we get people to think and know all the rest will follow, and God will get His own."
